Description

Designed in 1915 by Johan Rohde, Acorn pattern is perhaps the most famous of Jensen's flatware patterns.

The original Danish name for Acorn is konge which translates to king. The original name for Acanthus, the sister pattern to Rohde's Acorn design, is dronning which means queen.

- 16 table forks plus one extra table fork but it doesn't look the same quality
- 16 table knives
- 14 dessert forks
- 14 dessert or salad knives
- 14 dessert spoons
- 11 round bowl soup spoons
- 3 smaller round bowl spoons
- 3 tablespoons
- 1 pair salad servers
- 1 soup ladle
- 1 pickle fork
- 8 grapefruit spoons
- 6 butter knives
- 6 cake forks
- 6 fish forks
- 6 fish knives

Weight excludes table and dessert knives.
