## Description

Fine Victorian one-date-and-maker service of silver King's pattern cutlery for 12 settings. All pieces were made by Joseph & Albert Savory of London in 1844.

A popular English pattern, King's pattern features the honeysuckle flowers and shell motifs. Credited to the silversmithing brothers John and Henry Lias, the pattern dates from around 1820 and was heavily influenced by the decor and ornamentation of the period.

This King's pattern set comprises:

- 12 table forks
- 12 dessert forks
- 12 tablespoons
- 12 dessert spoons
- 12 teaspoons
- 2 gravy ladles

Since antique knives rarely survive, this flatware service includes are modern King's pattern silver knives with stainless steel blades, making them suitable for putting in the dishwasher:

- 12 table knives
- 12 dessert knives
